

Application for Teen Internship Program

Project Write Now is a nonprofit organization in Red Bank dedicated to building a vibrant writing community and helping people of all ages become better writers.

Our **Teen Internship Program** gives you the opportunity to be involved with our summer programs.

1. TEACHING ASSISTANT You will assist with teaching writing workshops under the supervision of one of our instructors to groups of children in our summer programs. During the training, you will learn how to design lesson plans based on what you love about writing. You will then be given the opportunity to teach throughout the summer.

2. THE INTERVIEW PROJECT In partnership with the Red Bank Public Library, this project has you interviewing seniors and other notable Red Bank citizens and documenting the stories they want to preserve. The goal is to provide bound copies to the library and the participant.

Dates and Times: All teens accepted into the program must attend our Internship Training Workshops. The Teaching Assistant Workshop runs on July 2, 3, & 5, from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. The Interview Project Workshop runs on July 2 & 3, from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. You must be able to attend every day.

Cost: There is a \$50 registration fee for this workshop. It is an unpaid internship, but you can receive community service hours for your participation.

Facilities: The Internship Training will take place at our studio in Red Bank (25 Bridge Ave., Suite 130).

Staff: Writers will be trained by Project Write Now staff who have substantial experience as professional writers and teachers.

Eligibility: Anyone ages 14 to 18 who lives within commuting distance is eligible to apply. We're looking for dynamic students who are responsible and take initiative.

For your essay, we are looking for more than just writing skills. We take into consideration your ideas and your willingness to open up and share your thoughts with us.

This is a competitive program—there will be a maximum of 16 students per workshop—so please complete this application thoroughly and with care.
